

SCEC Workshop on Future Postseismic Motion

Report for 2005

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At the 2004 SCEC annual meeting, a desire was expressed to have a workshop that would bring together members of the geodesy, modeling, and rock mechanics communities to discuss recent observations and theories of postseismic motion, and how these can be used to maximize the scientific returns from observing programs after the next large California earthquake. Given that resources are usually limited, and that deployments need to be made quickly, it would be extremely useful for the geodetic community to know what measurements should be made a high priority. We therefore proposed a workshop that would be an occasion for current results to be reviewed, for discussions to take place between the observational and modelling communities, and to discuss some of the logistical details that always end up driving many of the observations.

Unfortunately the pressure of other activities has not allowed us time to organize this as yet; we hope to do so for the spring of 2006.
